Polson, July 15.—(AP)—Search continued today for the body of N. T. Hanson, who drowned when his boat capsized in Flathead lake last Thursday.

Sheriff Wallace Baudry said sheriff's officers were dragging the lake near where Hanson and two companions were thrown into the water when a wave tipped over their small boat. The others clung to the overturned boat until help arrived.

BODY OF MAN DROWNED IN POLSON BAY FOUND THURS. EVENING

Polson, July 18.—(AP)—The body of N. T. Hanson, 45, of Forman, N. Dak., who drowned last week in Flathead lake, was recovered last night, Sheriff Wallace J. Baudry announced today.

The body was found near shore in shallow water in the deep northwest Montana lake, nearly four miles from where his boat capsized during a storm July 10. Two companions were rescued shortly after the accident.

Hanson had been working here temporarily, but his residence was listed as North Dakota.

BIGFORK RANCHER KILLED IN AUTO CRASH EAST TOWN

John Ashford Hendricks, 67, rancher in the Bigfork area, died of internal injuries and Solfus Olson, 47-year-old Missoula man, is in the Kalispell General hospital being treated for injuries received when cars driven by the two men collided on highway No. 2, four miles east of town about 5:10 Thursday afternoon.

Coroner Harry Campbell and investigating highway patrolmen said Hendricks was going east toward home and was drawing a trailer load of stock feed and crashed with Olson's car, which was heading west toward Kalispell, at the east approach of the No. 2 highway bridge over Flathead river.

It is reported Mr. Hendricks was killed almost instantly by the impact and Olson was taken to the hospital. Officers declare Hendricks was driving on his own side of the road at the time of the crash.

Olson suffered a fractured kneecap and dislocated hip and, due to shock, is still unable to give a coherent account of how the accident occurred. It was learned here today he is a leader in second-hand cash registers but is not associated with the National Cash Register company as previously believed. Both cars were badly damaged.

Officers have not determined the cause of the accident and an inquest will be held, it was stated by Coroner Campbell.

Mr. Hendricks has made his home about two miles east of Bigfork for the past five years. He is survived by his wife, Margaret, and two daughters, Mrs. Steve Strong of Choteau, and Mrs. Ethel Daisy of this vicinity. Funeral arrangements are as yet incomplete and will be announced later by the Waggener and Campbell funeral home.

Word was received here this morning from the War department that the body of Sergeant Donald R. Huck will arrive in Kalispell next Friday noon. Sergeant Huck was returned to the United States from England on the first shipload of war dead to be returned to the United States. The body was then taken to the general distribution depot at Fort Ogden, Utah, and is being forwarded to Kalispell this week. Funeral arrangements will be announced later in the week by the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home.



SGT. DONALD R. HUCK

Donald R. Huck was born July 19, 1924, at Kalispell, Montana, the son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Milton Huck. He grew up here and attended the Kalispell schools, graduating from Flathead County high school with honors in June of 1942. In the fall of 1942, Donald moved to Missoula with his parents where he entered the university, majoring in music.

On August 3, 1943, he was inducted into the army at Fort Lewis, Washington. After completing his primary training, he attained the rating of Sergeant in the Army Air Force and was assigned to a bomber crew. In October, 1944, he left the states with his crew for England and was assigned there to the Third Division of the Eighth Air Force. On December 24, 1944, while on a mission to the German oil refineries near Frankfurt-on-Main, the group met a strong force of German fighter planes over Liege, Belgium, and only five of the plane's crew survived the attack. Sergeant Huck had previously been awarded the Air Medal and his parents received his Purple Heart award after his death.

Surviving Donald are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. Milton Huck of Missoula; one sister, Mrs. Helen H. Voelker of Covina, Calif.; and three brothers, Harley M. Huck of Seattle, Wash., Vernon G. Huck of Spokane, Wash., and Robert E. Huck, attending college at Colorado Springs, Colo.
