BODY OF PFC. LAWRENCE JOHNSON ARRIVES IN NEW YORK SUNDAY

Word has been received in Kalispell that the body of Private First Class Lawrence C. Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Chester Johnson of this city, is among the 21 Montana war dead who arrived in New York Sunday aboard the ship Joseph V. Connolly. Private Johnson's body will be brought to Kalispell for burial. It was stated.

The body of Sergeant Donald R. Huck, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Huck of Missoula, former residents of Kalispell, was also among the war dead which arrived in New York Sunday.

Body Of Lawrence Johnson Expected To Arrive Nov. 12

According to word received from the War department, the body of Lawrence Johnson, first of Flathead county's World war II dead to be returned, will arrive in Kalispell next Wednesday afternoon. Pfc. Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Chester Johnson of 350 Second avenue east north in Kalispell, was killed in action near Merken, Germany, on Dec. 11, 1944.



Lawrence C. Johnson was born June 1, 1924, at Kalispell, attended grade and high school here, graduating with the class of 1942. During his youth he was very active in the Legion sponsored Boy Scout troop No. 11. He registered for the service on the last day of school and during the year following, while waiting for his call to the army, worked for the Great Northern railroad and the Woodland Flower shop. On May 23, 1943, he was called to active duty with the army.

Starting in the anti-aircraft in the personnel department. Lawrence was transferred to the infantry division. He completed infantry training and was sent overseas in August, 1944. He was assigned to Co. C, 415th Regiment of the famed 104th "Timberwolves" Division and was fighting with this unit when killed.

Besides his parents, Lawrence is survived by his sister, Joyce (Mrs. Raymond Bergstrom) of Kalispell; grandfathers, Oscar Johnson of Kalispell and E. N. Lippincott, a former resident of Kalispell now living at Seattle; also other relatives and a great many friends.

Public funeral services with the local veterans' organizations participating will be held later in the week, the time and place to be announced by the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home.
