J. J. Lebert, Early Day Resident, Dies

John Joseph Lebert, age 76, passed away at his home at 461 California street early Wednesday morning.

He, with his brother worked in the construction of the Northwest Lumber Co. dam. Road Mishap Takes Life of Mrs. Della Liningner Wednesday

Injuries received when she stepped out of a backward-rolling automobile Wednesday afternoon were fatal for Mrs. Della Liningner, 73-year-old resident of the Valley for many years.

Mrs. Liningner died as she was being taken into the hospital shortly after 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Coroner Harry Campbell reported the tragedy occurred about 1:30 in the McManamy Draw country 12 miles northwest of here when Mrs. Liningner, in company with her daughter, Mrs. Leone Aurand, and granddaughter, Mrs. Mark Meyers, drove out on the county road to look for mushrooms. The machine, driven by Mrs. Meyers, stalled on a hill. Coroner Campbell was told, and then started rolling back down. As the car backed up Mrs. Liningner became excited, opened the front door of the machine and stepped out. As she stepped to the road the door struck her and knocked her down. She received severe head injuries. The car was reported under control up to the time the door struck Mrs. Liningner down but then went crosswise and stopped against a bank on the right side of the road. The victim was placed back in the machine and taken to the A. A. O. Claire ranch nearby. From the ranch she was rushed to the Kalispell hospital, where she died.

Coroner Campbell deemed an inquest unnecessary following an investigation with a member of the highway patrol.

Mrs. Liningner had been a resident of the Flathead since about 1905 and had lived at Superior, Whitefish and Kalispell and had been living with Mrs. Aurand just east of town.
