Ronan, Sept. 26—(AP)—An inquest was being held here late today in the death of G. H. McCormick, 73, who, Sheriff-Coroner Wallace Beaudry declared, set fire to buildings at his farm yesterday, then shot himself in the head.

Beaudry said the Ronan fire department put out blazes in the farm home, barn, garage and machine shop, but not until the fires had made considerable headway. The amount of damage has not been determined.

The sheriff said the man's body was found in the yard, a bullet hole in the forehead and a pistol nearby.

Mrs. McCormick was not at home at the time.

McCormick was a retired electrician. Relatives include his widow and two daughters who live in the east.

### John McIntosh, One Of City's First Merchants, Passes

John McIntosh, 91, pioneer merchant of Kalispell, passed away Saturday, Nov. 29, at his residence, 511 Fourth avenue east.

Mr. McIntosh came here in 1891 and had witnessed many changes in Kalispell. The railroad had not yet come through, there were no residential or business buildings here and he took part in the erection of many of them.

He was the founder of the McIntosh Music House, a firm still operating and bearing his name but now being operated by his son, Franklin B. McIntosh. He built the McIntosh opera house in 1904 and one of the first plays presented there was "Uncle Tom's Cabin." In 1909 he sold his hardware and electrical business and went into the automobile business.

He suffered a broken hip in July of this year and never fully recovered from the shock.

Mr. McIntosh was born July 23, 1856, in Bruce county, Ontario, Can. He came to the United States in 1876 and lived at various places in the Dakotas, finally settling at Bottineau, N. Dak., where he resided until 1891 when he came to Kalispell, where he had resided continuously since.

In 1893 he was married to Sophia Hodgson, who passed away June 15, 1920. He is survived by two sons, Franklin B. and Allen J., both of Kalispell; two daughters, Helen K. McIntosh of Kalispell and Mrs. Lil-
