**APGAR MAN KILLED  
IN TRUCK MISHAP  
NEAR H-H DAMSITE**

Charles Francis Powers of Apgar was killed late this morning in the first fatal accident in the Hungry Horse project area, according to Coroner Harry Campbell, who reported the man died from severe head injuries when struck by logs rolling off a truck.

According to the coroner, Deputy Sheriff Wm. Donegan and Project Safety Engineer Howard Lathan, who investigated the tragic accident, the logs were being transported by truck to a small sawmill and en route to the mill the truck became stuck on a steep grade. Powers and his companion, Don Nash, climbed to the top of the load to unload the logs from the truck and the second log to be moved struck the upper end of the bunker arm and pulled the holding cable, and a heavy steel eye gave way, releasing the entire load. Both men were thrown to the ground.
