Tokyo, June 2.—(UP)—General headquarters tonight announced the names of 40 persons killed Thursday night when a four-engined army courier plane inbound from Korea crashed on a mountainside 30 miles southwest of Tokyo.

The casualties—there were no survivors—included 36 military personnel and four civilians, one of them Philip A. Adler, foreign correspondent for the Detroit News.
