Whitefish Boy Is Drowning Victim; Search For Body

An eight-year-old boy whose last name was given as Vance and who was reported as living near the lower end of Kalkspell avenue in Whitefish was drowned about 11:30 this morning when he fell into the Whitefish river while playing near the dam at the lower end of Columbia avenue, at the southeastern suburbs, it was reported from Whitefish this noon.

Sheriff Dick Walsh was notified and went to Whitefish immediately with members of his force. Members of the Whitefish fire department and officers are searching for the body, it was stated.

The water below the dam where the accident is reported to have happened is said to be swift and deep. The body had not been found at the time of going to press.

Diver Recovers Body Of John Vance From River

The body of John Vance, 8, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Vance of Whitefish who was drowned while fishing from the dam in the Whitefish river Tuesday morning, June 24, was recovered Monday morning at 11:19 ending an intensive week-long search by members of the sheriff's force and a large group of volunteers, it was reported from Whitefish this morning.

The body was recovered by W. B. Guinan who came from Ennis with diving apparatus to assist in the search. Mr. Guinan was aided by Troy Lane of Great Falls at the controls.

The two men arrived at the scene of the tragedy Saturday evening and continued the search until the body was found Monday morning. The body was found about 175 feet below the dam and upstream from where it was last seen and lying face-down in a pocket on the bottom of the river about 30 feet from the south shore. The recovery was made in 20 feet of water.

The bottom of the river is littered with debris and it is possible that grappling hooks used by the searchers may have passed over the body without taking hold, it was stated.

At the time of the accident Sheriff Dick Walsh and members of his force went to Whitefish and remained on the scene continuously until the body was found. Many volunteers offered their assistance, boats

were used in the search and a plane flew over the area in an effort to locate the lad.

The body is at the Catron funeral home and services will be held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock.
