WELL-KNOWN POLSON MAN, CLAUDE COWMAN, DIES AT HOME THERE

(Flathead Courier—Polson)

Claude Cowman, 69, one of the pioneers of Polson and founder and first co-publisher, with his mother, of the Flathead Courier, passed away suddenly at his home last Thursday night. Mr. Cowman was born September 6, 1887, at Prairie City, Iowa.

He joined Company "F" of the 1st Iowa Infantry Volunteers in the Spanish-American War. This was the only army ever raised in this country during war time completely composed of volunteers. Mr. Cowman was one of the youngest members of this Infantry division.

Following the newspaper business Mr. Cowman held the franchise for the bus line from Kalispell, which he later sold to the Intermountain Transportation Co. He was one of the organizers of the Veterans of Foreign Wars post in Polson and was a member of Polson Lodge No. 18, A. F. & A. M.

Funeral services were held on Sunday at 2 p. m. from the Reitz Chapel with full military honors, conducted by the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Mr. Cowman is survived by his widow, Eunice, and a daughter, Mrs. Lon Cabbage. Mrs. Cowman was the former Eunice Bouton of Kalispell.

Dr. James W. Craig, age 69, of Circle, Montana, passed away at Glendive, Montana Dec. 28. Dr. Craig practiced medicine in Browning from 1923 to 1928 and in Eureka from 1928 to 1930.
