Lee Howard Abel passed away Wednesday at a rooming house in Columbia Falls. Mr. Abel had been a resident of the Montana State Soldiers' home and came to Columbia Falls yesterday to consult a doctor. The death was discovered about noon Wednesday when a friend was requested by the landlady to go in and wake him and she unlocked the door. Coroner Campbell and Sheriff Walsh made the investigation. Mr. Abel had been suffering from a weak heart and had taken an overdose of sleeping tablets.

Mr. Abel was 62 years of age and came to the Soldiers' home from Livingston, Mont., in November, 1945. Funeral arrangements are as yet incomplete and will be announced later by the Waggener & Campbell funeral home.

Word has been received that the body of Private First Class Leland A. Peterson has arrived at the Caspaso, Utah, Distribution Center from Germany and is being forwarded to Katisfield. It is scheduled to arrive here Friday noon accompanied by military escort.

Funeral services for PFC. Peterson have been set for Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Wagner & Campbell Chapel with Rev. Simon O. Johnson of the Bethlehem Lutheran church officiating. Interment will follow in the Veterans Section of Conrad Memorial Cemetery where the local American Legion and V.F.W. Posts will conduct full military rites.

Leland A. Peterson was born Au-



gust 19, 1924 at Charlson, North Dakota. He came with his parents to Montana in 1937 at the age of 13 years and made their home at Somers. Leland attended the Somers school and later was employed by the Somers Lumber company until his induction in the army on May 28, 1943.

After the completion of his training in the states, he was assigned to General Patton's 3rd army and sent overseas in August, 1944.

PFC. Peterson was killed in action in Luxembourg on December 28, 1944 during the famed battle of the bulge. Surviving him are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Weldon Peterson; three brothers, Donald, Larry and Harold, all living at their home in the Creston district; and one sister, Mrs. Winnifred Gonvick of Gonvick, Minn.

POLSON PLUMBER IS KILLED IN AUTO MISHAP NEAR HELENA.

Helena, Nov. 27.—(P)—Injuries received when he was hit by a skidding truck Friday killed Nels Jorgen Anderson, 66, Polson plumber, State Highway Patrolman Alfred Mues reported.

Anderson died in a Helena hospital this morning.

Mues said Anderson was outside his stalled car on MacDonald pass when a truck skidded on the slippery road and hit Anderson and a state highway truck which was pulling the auto out of a snowbank.

Louie Atkinson, Helena, was driving the truck and Joe Pierce the highway sanding truck, Mues reported.

Pierce jumped clear of the oncoming truck.

Anderson, who was returning home after spending Thanksgiving in Helena, apparently did not see Atkinson's truck coming along the highway, Mues said.

Mrs. Lucille Bailie, Missoula, occupied injury in Anderson's car. Occupants of Atkinson's truck were unhurt also.

Anderson had lived in Polson 12 years.
