Richard Barnes Killed In Truck Mishap Near Dam

Injuries he received when he leaped from his truck proved fatal for Richard Eugene Barnes, 30, of Whitefish early Friday afternoon at Emery creek near the Hungry Horse project.

Few details of the accident are known, but Coroner Harry Campbell was advised that Barnes' truck was running down-grade out of control and the man evidently intended to leap from the cab when the car door struck and threw him to the road where he was injured by the rear wheels of the machine. The Kallispell ambulance was called but he passed away before it arrived. The mishap occurred in the Emery creek region, scene of increasing lumbering activity due to the dam project near by. It was not learned what job the victim was employed on.

Mr. Barnes was a resident of Whitefish and is survived by his wife, Blanche, and three daughters, Fay, age eight, Judy, age six, and Bonita, age three years. There are also two brothers, four sisters and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Chester Barnes.

In November, 1942, he embarked from Camp Pickett, Va., with Company F, 30th infantry, 3rd division. He was in the campaign in Africa and in Italy. He volunteered to serve on the Anzio beach-head and lost his life in the campaign on Feb. 20, 1944. He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harvey H. The two men brought the boy to shore and artificial respiration was given. A call was sent to Polson for help and Dr. John Dimon, Fire Chief Brown and Sheriff Beaudry and members of his force arrived on the scene shortly. It was stated a resuscitator was used on the lad without success.

Lake county officials along with Sheriff Dick Walsh and City Fireman Willard McPheeters who flew to Big Arm in a Seabee amphibian plane piloted by Lew Leach of Table Bay on Flathead lake, and members of Sheriff's Walsh's force who went to Big Arm by car, dragged the lake for Burton's body. Walsh and McPheeters arrived there a few minutes after the call was received here. Burton's body was found about 3 o'clock in 29 feet of water at approximately the same place where the boat capsized, according to Sheriff Beaudry.
