Inquest May Be Called In Death of Child at Rexford

Abby, Dec. 29 —(T)— Acting Coroner Fred Maurer says he may hold an inquest into the death of four year old Benjamin Crosley, who died when flames destroyed a tavern and hotel above it in Rexford, 36 miles northeast of here.

The coroner said Dave Hansen, about 42, co-owner of the tavern, was burned seriously in a futile attempt to rescue the boy after Hansen had saved the child's sister, Margaret, 5.

Hansen was hospitalized in Whitefish.

Maurer said the fire apparently started early yesterday when a kerosene bathroom stove became overheated and exploded in the wood building. The children of Mrs. Margaret De Shazer, who worked in the tavern, were asleep in the upstairs rooms when the fire broke out.

Maurer said Hansen ran upstairs and brought down the little girl. He was burned as he sought, unsuccessfully, to find the boy, the coroner said.
