He is survived by his mother, a brother and a sister in Lewiston, Idaho. The body is at the Johnson funeral home and funeral arrangements are pending the arrival of his relatives.

DON EISENMAN IS DROWNING VICTIM AT LAKE M'GREGOR

Donald Eisenman, about 33, a KallsPELL man, was drowned Sunday morning in Lake McGregor when the boat from which he and Melvin Sundt of Kila were fishing capsized.

Just how the accident occurred is not known as there were no witnesses. It was stated by members of the sheriff's force who are attempting to recover the body. It was stated the two men clung to the boat until Eisenman's strength failed and he went under. Sundt was rescued later and taken to the KallsPELL hospital. His condition was reported improved this morning.

Due to the deep waters of the lake, members of the sheriff's force are encountering considerable difficulty in locating the body, it was stated.

Eisenman's Body Not Yet Found

Search for the body of Donald Eisenman who was drowned Sunday morning in Lake McGregor when the boat from which he was fishing capsized, is continuing with Sheriff Dick Walsh and a crew of 12 or 15 men searching for the body.

Melvin Sundt was with Eisenman at the time and the two men clung to the side of the overturned boat for several hours, it was reported. Eisenman's strength failed and he went under. Sundt was rescued and taken to the KallsPELL hospital suffering from shock and exposure. His condition was reported as improved Monday morning.

The part of the lake where the search is being conducted is extremely deep, causing difficulty to the searchers. It was reported from the sheriff's office.

Old-Time Resident Of Valley Passes

Maud Sophia Everett passed away Sunday morning at her home at Kila at the age of 61 years. Mrs. Everett has been an old-time resident of that area, living there for the past 45 years.

Surviving her are her husband, Seth; one daughter, Mrs. Sylvia Linstead of Kila; three sons, Raymond H. of Bremerton, Washington, Seth, Jr., and Loyal V. of KallsPELL. Funeral services have been set for Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Waggener and Campbell chapel with the Rev. Frank Hillis officiating. Interment will follow in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
