## Robert Farrington Killed In Wreck

According to word received here this morning, Robert R. Farrington was killed in an automobile accident at Kennewick, Washington Saturday morning.

Mr. Farrington was riding in an auto with three other persons when it collided with a lumber truck and he was killed instantly.

Mr. Farrington was 39 years of age and had made his home most of his life in Kalispell, leaving here about a year and a half ago to work with a construction company in the Richland, Wash. area. Surviving him are two sons, James and William, of Kalispell; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Farrington of Whitefish and one sister, Mrs. F. E. Branson of Whitefish. The body will be brought to Kalispell for services and interment, the time and place of which will be announced later by the Waggener and Campbell funeral home.

Word has been received here from the Capasso, Utah general distribution depot that the body of Sergeant Kenneth E. Felix, has arrived there and is being forwarded to Kalspell. The body is scheduled to arrive here Thursday noon and will be taken to the Waggener & Campbell funeral home from where services will be held later in the



week. Kenneth Eldon Felix was born January 21, 1922 at Bigfork, Montana to William L. and Mabel Felix. At the age of seven he moved with the family to Kalspell where he attended grade and high school graduating from Flathead high with the class of 1940. In September, 1940, Kenneth enlisted in Company "F" of the national guard and received his training at Fort Lewis, Washington. In March, 1942, he was sent to the south Pacific with the 41st division. Sgt. Felix was killed on Bikini Island on June 16, 1944 while on duty as ammunition sergeant for the 163rd infantry regiment.

Surviving him are his mother, Mr. Mabel Felix of Kalspell; one brother, William Felix of Billings; and two sisters, Virginia M. Ramsey of Kalspell and Frances L. Hensley of Havre, Montana. Kenneth's father passed away at Bigfork on June 11, 1925.

## One Killed, Two Injured Due To Wreck Saturday

Robert D. Flechsing, 24, Missoula, died in the Kalispell hospital Monday morning, July 5, of injuries received Saturday afternoon, July 3, when the car he was driving left the highway at a curve about one-half mile east of Kalispell on highway No. 2, crashing through the Kalispell Chamber of Commerce welcome sign. It was stated that Flechsing's death was due to a severe skull fracture.

Riding with Flechsing at the time of the accident were Herman Kalen and Henry Kujewa, both of Kalispell.

The highway patrol was immediately called to the scene and in turn summoned two ambulances and members of the city police and sheriff's force. The injured men were taken to the Kalispell hospital where Kalen and Kujewa are being

treated for internal injuries, cuts and bruises. Their conditions were reported today as improved by the attending doctors.

Flechsing's body was forwarded to Missoula Tuesday morning by the Johnson funeral home. He is survived by his widow, Lucille, his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Flechsing of Missoula, and other relatives.

Coroner Harry H. Campbell said there will be no inquest as Flechsing was the driver of the car.

## LOGGING TRUCK DRIVER LOSES LIFE IN MISHAP

Ralph Albert Foster, Whitefish, was accidentally killed about 4 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at Columbia Falls while unloading logs from his truck at the Plum Creek Logging company millsite.

According to witnesses, Mr. Foster had crawled under his truck to release the binder chain over the load of logs. After releasing the chain the logs failed to roll from the truck, but when Mr. Foster stepped from beneath the load to attempt to dislodge them, the top log on the truck suddenly gave way, striking him across the shoulders and chest.

Members of the sheriff's force and Coroner Harry Campbell are investigating the accident but feel that an inquest will be unnecessary.

Mr. Foster was 21 years of age and had come to this vicinity about a year ago from Little Fork, Minnesota. He was a veteran of World War II and is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leo Foster of Whitefish; three brothers, Gerald of Minneapolis, Rex of Littlefork, Minn., and Boyd of Kalspell; one sister, Mrs. Myrtle Fairchild of Glennece, Minn. The body is at the Catron chapel in Whitefish and will be taken to Windom, Minn. tonight where services and interment will take place.

Susan Gay Friedrich, two-year-old daughter of Mrs. John D. Gauss of 1420 Third avenue east was instantly killed Saturday afternoon when she was thrown from a car and run over by a logging truck, the accident occurring on a side road to highway 93 eight miles north of Kalispell.

According to the coroner, sheriff and highway patrol who investigated, Mr. and Mrs. Gauss and two children and Dorothy Lewis were going west on the side road when they met a logging truck driven by Glenn Brown. Mr. Gauss who was driving, attempted to turn out but due to the icy roads, the front of the car turned to the right, leaving the rear wheels in the tracks. The logging truck turned out but the front wheels of the truck or trailer struck the rear fender of the Gauss car, spinning it around and throwing the occupants out. The little girl was run over by the truck which stopped just short of running over Mrs. Lewis.
