Body of Sailor To Be Brought Home

Word has been received here from the Ogden, Utah, distribution center that the body of Seaman 2/c Louis O. Kaber will arrive in Whitefish on Wednesday of this week. The body will be taken to the Catron chapel where service arrangements will be held later in the week.



Seaman Kaber was born in Enderlin, N. Dak., in 1927. At the age of 5, he moved to Whitefish with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter Kaber and there received his education, graduating from Whitefish high in 1944. He was inducted into the U. S. navy in the fall of 1944 and received his training at Farragut, Ida. He embarked from Camp Park, California, with a Seabee unit and was stationed at Tinian. He was killed there on Jan. 29, 1945, when a dynamite dump which he was guarding was exploded by Japanese sniper fire. Louis was 18 years of age at the time of his death.

Surviving him are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter Kaber; three brothers, Marvin, Harry and Larry; and two sisters, Emma Lou and Louise, all living at Whitefish.

The actress-wife of a former Kalispell man died recently amid dramatic surroundings while engaged in acting in a stage play at a Los Angeles theater, according to the Los Angeles Times.

Miss Miriam King, 31-year-old wife of Jack Holland who formerly lived here with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Holland, collapsed on the stage near the end of a benefit skit and succumbed. Death was attributed to a heart attack.

The audience of over 300 saw her fall but believed it part of the act and her stage partner also thought she had fainted and improvised lines at this point. She was taken backstage and when it was learned she was dead the show was stopped.

Holland is a Hollywood magazine writer and director of a prominent theatrical group in California.

Sawing with him at the time was John Galloway who escaped and called other woodsmen. The snag crushed Kiser's body and thighs. He died while being taken to the main road, highway No. 2. Coroner Campbell was called and brought the body to Kalispell.
