FINAL MILITARY RITES FOR LIEUT. O'NEIL AT POMONA

The body of First Lieutenant John O'Neil, who was killed in ac-tion June 3, 1944 in Italy is being returned to the O'Neil home at Po-mona, Calif., for final military rites.

For extraordinary achievement in the action in which he was fatat-ly wounded, O'Neil was posthumously decorated with the Distinguished Service Cross.

Lieutenant O'Neil, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles I. O'Neh was a former resident of Kalispell and was well known here, being associated in business at the Forest Products Co. here with his brothers, Lawrence and Charles O'Neil. He was married in Kalispell. He enlisted in the army in February, 1942 and was commissioned an offcer in the inwent overseas in October of 1943.

FINAL RITES HELD FOR LT. O'NEIL IN POMONA RECENTLY

Final rites for First Lieut, John D. O'Neil, who was killed in Jtaly June 3, 1944, were held recently at Po-mona, Calif. Rev. N. Robert Kesler, associate pastor of Trinity Methodist church, and Post No. 30 of the American Legion conducted the services.

Lieutenant O'Neil, a former resident of Kalispell, went to California about 26 years ago and completed his schooling there. Shortly, before the battle in which he was killed, he was decorated with the purple heart and oak leaf cluster for being twice wounded in action. He was posthumously awarded the distinguished service cross.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Helen O'Neil Anderson of this city; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. I. nis parents, Air. and Airs. C. I.
