At that time Mr. Odenwald was struck by falling fuel when a portion of the fuel pile caved in causing him injuries in the pelvic region. He was 63 years of age and had made his home in Somers since 1919 and lived for the year prior to that in the Swan Lake vicinity.

Surviving Mr. Odenwald are his wife, Grace, and one son, Charles.

Mr. Odenwald had been a long-time member of the Kalispell Odd Fellows lodge.

**FINAL MILITARY
RITES FOR LIEUT.
O'NEIL AT POMONA**

The body of First Lieutenant John O'Neil, who was killed in action June 3, 1944 in Italy is being returned to the O'Neil home at Pomona, Calif., for final military rites.

For extraordinary achievement in the action in which he was fatally wounded, O'Neil was posthumously decorated with the Distinguished Service Cross.

Lieutenant O'Neil, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles I. O'Neil was a former resident of Kalispell and was well known here, being associated in business at the Forest Products Co. here with his brothers, Lawrence and Charles O'Neil. He was married in Kalispell. He enlisted in the army in February, 1942 and was commissioned an officer in the infantry in November of that year. He went overseas in October of 1943.

**FINAL RITES HELD
FOR LT. O'NEIL IN
POMONA RECENTLY**

Final rites for First Lieut. John D. O'Neil, who was killed in Italy June 3, 1944, were held recently at Pomona, Calif. Rev. N. Robert Kester, associate pastor of Trinity Methodist church, and Post No. 30 of the American Legion conducted the services.

Lieutenant O'Neil, a former resident of Kalispell, went to California about 26 years ago and completed his schooling there. Shortly before the battle in which he was killed, he was decorated with the purple heart and oak leaf cluster for being twice wounded in action. He was posthumously awarded the distinguished service cross.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Helen O'Neil Anderson of this city; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. I. O'Neil of Pomona; two sisters, Mrs. Harvey Zeigler of Pomona and Mrs. Robert Kroger of Kalispell, and two brothers, Lawrence and Charles, both of Kalispell.

Previous to entering the service, Lieutenant O'Neil was associated here with his brothers in the Forest Products company.
