

### Body of Sergeant Unwin Homebound

Word has been received here that the body of Sergeant Edward W. Unwin has arrived at the Caspago, Utah general distribution depot, and is being forwarded from there to Kalispell. Military escort will accompany the body to Kalispell, arriving next Wednesday. The body



will be taken to the Waggoner & Campbell funeral home from where services will be held later in the week.

Edward W. Unwin, son of Mrs. Garrit Van Rinsum of Somers, was born June 1, 1921 at Steamboat Springs, Colorado. At the age of three he moved with his mother to Somers where he grew up and attended the public school. Edward graduated from Flathead high in the spring of 1939. While still in high school, he joined the national guard and soon after his graduation, left Kalispell with Company F for active duty. Early in the spring of 1942 he sailed with the 41st division for Australia, arriving there in May of 1942.

Sergeant Unwin passed away in Brisbane, Australia on July 22, 1942 at the age of 21 years. Surviving him besides his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Garrit Van Rinsum are a brother, Francis, and a sister, Beverly, living at home, and grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Scovill, all residing at Somers.

The body arrived in Kalispell this afternoon from the Utah distribution center.
