Elderly Valley Rancher Passes

Joseph L. Vandevanter passed away this morning at his farm home 11 miles northeast of Kalspell. Mr. Vandevanter came to this district about 28 years ago, making his home on the reservation for about 14 years, in Kalspell for about seven years and at his farm home the past 16 years.

He was 80 years of age at the time of his death.

Surviving him are two sons, Russell and Eugene, and one granddaughter, all living at the home ranch. Mr. Vandevanter's wife, Myrtle, preceded him in death in 1944. Funeral arrangements are as yet incomplete and will be announced later by the Waggoner & Campbell funeral home.
