Boy Killed In Toboggan Accident

TROY — A winter camp out on Callahan Creek six miles south of Troy turned into a death Thursday with two other Boy Scouts injured after a toboggan struck a snow concealed stump.

Killed was Chris Chambers, 13, Troy, son of Mr. and Mrs. Tom Chambers. Lincoln County Sheriff John Fisher said the youth suffered a broken neck when he was catapulted over the toboggan and into the stump. Two other scouts riding with Chambers were injured.

Pete Smith, 14, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Smith, Troy, was hospitalized at St. John's Lutheran Hospital, Libby, for treatment of severe mouth and facial lacerations. Craig Martin, 13, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dick Martin, Troy, was released after treatment of minor injuries.

The fatal accident occurred about 5 p.m., Fisher reported. Other boys had used the sliding area and encountered the stump at a glancing angle. They shouted a warning back up the hill but apparently the trio on the toboggan did not hear it. They crashed into the stump dead center.

Young Chambers is survived by his parents, a brother, Randy, and a sister, Debra, at the family home.

R. D. Chapman Dies Of Injuries

Ronald D. Chapman, 21, Rt. 4, Creston, died about noon Thursday at the Kalispell General Hospital.

Chapman was injured in a single vehicle accident at 8:45 a.m. Thursday 29 miles west of Kalispell on Highway 2. His death was attributed to severe back and internal injuries according to Flathead County Deputy Coroner David O. Cutler.

Authorities have decided against conducting an inquest.

Cutler says the circumstances are clear cut and an inquest would not provide any additional information.

Chapman was a passenger in a pickup truck driven by Russell A. Huston, 21, Rt. 1, Bigfork. Investigating officers said Huston apparently went to sleep at the wheel. The truck drifted off the roadway and traveled 150 feet in an angling plunge over a steep 80-foot bank rolling twice in the accident pattern.

Both men were thrown out as was Rasiene Chapman, 21, wife of the victim. Huston suffered a broken shoulder, Mrs. Chapman ankle injuries. The pickup was demolished.

The fatality is the sixth traffic accident of the year in Flathead County and the third in the past nine days in the area.
