## Millworker Dies From Injuries

## Eureka Woman Dies In Crossing Crash

**EUREKA**—Mrs. Ruth L. Hibbert, 72, was instantly killed at the Eureka grade crossing at 11:40 a.m. Wednesday when her car was struck by a westbound Great Northern Railway freight train.

The fatality is a near twin to the one of Nov. 29, 1967, on the same crossing which resulted in the death of Mrs. Joe Van Bemmel Jr., Eureka.

Mrs. Hibbert's small coup-

pet car was knocked 118 feet from the point of impact by the freight train moving at about 50 miles an hour. The car came to rest within 10 feet of the main line tracks.

Investigating officers, Montana Highway Patrol District Sgt. Al Rierson and Division Capt. Ray Olson expressed the belief Mrs. Hibbert was returning to her home a block away and did not see or hear the approaching train when she drove onto the crossing. Investigation is being continued with Lincoln County Deputy Sheriff Neil Salisbury and Coroner Hal Gompf has been notified.

The head end crew of the freight train, engineer Mervin

Truher, conductor James Jorgenson and brakeman Vernon Elam, all of Whitfish, said the train whistle was sounding as it approached the crossing.

Mrs. Hibbert is survived by her husband George at the family home, one son in Eureka, two sons in Salt Lake City, Utah, and other relatives. Her death is the 10th traffic mishap of this year in Lincoln County and sets a new all time traffic fatality toll in the county.
