Libby Hunter Dies From Heart Attack

LIBBY — Lincoln County authorities have their hands full with hunter problems. One hunter died of natural causes and two others were reported lost. Coroner Hal Gompf and Libby Police Officer Don Shaw responded on a call at 1:25 a.m. today centering on a report that Joseph W. Sheffield, 520 Nevada Ave., had incurred a heart attack near the area of his hunting cabin in the East Fisher River drainage. The report was confirmed with Gompf and Shaw up all night in completing the task of returning Sheffield's body to Libby. Walter Humble and Dan Rice were reported as lost in the Tubb Gulch area in the Rainy Creek drainage across from Zanolite Mountain. The two men went out at 8 a.m. Monday and failed to return from their hunting. They were both in the same party. Sheriff John Fisher says Rice is an experienced woodsman and he believes both men may have taken shelter against the weather waiting for daylight to make their way out of the woods.

Ronan Man Killed In Truck Crash

POISON — A Ronan man was killed and three persons injured in Lake County's first traffic fatality in 181 days.

Dead is Eugene R. Shepard, 33, Ronan, hospitalized in St. Joseph's Hospital, Poison, and listed in fair condition are Raymond P. Staples, 30, Chario,

driver of the 1-1/2 ton farm truck that was the death vehicle, and his wife, Jeanette, 23. Treated for minor injuries and released was Mrs. Mickey Shephard, 36.

Investigation into the accident is being continued by Montana Highway Patrolman Ray Brander and Lake County Coroner Bill Phillips. No decision has been made on an inquest. Shepard was apparently crushed and was suffocated according to preliminary investigation.

Staples and Mrs. Shepard were trapped in the crushed down cab of the farm truck. It took porta-power hydraulic equipment to release them after they had been in the wreckage for about 45 minutes.

Brander reported the vehicle northbound for Creston to pick up a load of grain. Apparently Staples lost control on a straight stretch of wet pavement about eight miles north of Poison, just south of the Skidoo turnoff on Montana Highway 35.

The truck went off the east side of the road. Staples fought the steering wheel, apparently overcorrected, the truck crossed the highway and went off into the west borrow pit, overturned and crushed down the cab of the vehicle.

Funeral services are pending from Shrider's Mortuary at Ronan.

Shepard is survived by his widow and six children at home.

It was the first traffic fatality of this year in Lake County and the fifth in Northwest Montana for 1968.

LIBBY — An 18-year-old expectant mother and her unborn child died about 8 p.m. Sunday at St. John's Hospital, Libby, of gunshot injuries.

The victim was Mrs. Amber L. Spence. Her child would have been born in December. She was brought to the hospital by her husband, Dennis, about 5 p.m. after a bullet from a rifle hit her in the left side of the abdomen. Spence told Lincoln County Sheriff John Fisher he was cleaning the weapon when it discharged at their home three miles south of Libby on Highway 2.

Surgeons had hoped the child was still alive but they failed to detect any heart beat and the child was undelivered. Fisher was first notified of the incident by Robert Wilson.

Working with Lincoln County Coroner Hal Gompf, a coroner's jury has been empaneled to make formal inquiry in the death.

Log Truck Driver Killed Near Troy

TROY — Spotting of a forest fire by the Yaak Mountain lookout on the Kootenai National Forest led to the discovery of Lincoln County's seventh traffic fatality of the year.

Basil E. Stapley, 49, Troy, was killed when he apparently attempted to jump clear of his out of control loaded logging truck coming out of O'Brien Creek 11 miles northwest of Troy. The Montana Highway Patrol said Stapley was apparently run down by the vehicle which continued another 130 feet from the point where his body was found beside the road. The truck plunged over a steep bank, caught fire and burned.

It was the smoke from the fire spotted at 7:05 p.m. Thursday by the Yaak lookout which sent authorities to the scene.

The single axle rig loaded with 16-foot logs was considered a total wreck from crash damage and fire. No inquest is planned.

There is some question by investigating officers whether brakes went out on the vehicle or Stapley failed to negotiate the downgrade.
