WHITEFISH — LeRoy Van Vleck, 77, 217 Central, Whitefish, died Sunday evening in Warm Springs.

Mr. Van Vleck was born Nov. 7, 1890, at Rushville, Neb. He had attended schools and spent his early life in Nebraska. The couple returned to Whitefish where Mr. Van Vleck had continued in the barbering profession until his retirement. He had spent a short time in Fairbanks, Alaska, and was also employed by the Whitefish Water Department as a caretaker for a short time.

He is now survived by his widow, Edra, at the family home; two brothers, Harmon of Jackson, Wyo., and DeForrest of Hawthorne, Calif., and several nieces and nephews.
