Charles Irwin

WHITEFISH — Funeral services for Charles Irwin, 63, were held at the Austin Chapel Tuesday 2 p.m. with the Rev. Father John F. Cronin of St. Charles Catholic Church officiating.

Mr. Irwin died Saturday. He was born May 18, 1908 at Harrisburg, Ill., and when nine moved with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William H. Irwin to Spokane.

He was employed by the Spokesman Review and Chronicle until 1941 and then by the San Pedro (Calif.) News Pilot before entering the U.S. Air Force.

In 1946 he moved to Whitefish

where he was co-founder of the HutChuck Boat and Cabinet Shop. In 1958, He and Mrs. Irwin built Downtowner Motel which they operated with the HutChuck Sporting Goods Shop. They sold the shop in 1967 and continued to manage the motel.

Mr. Irwin was a past president of Whitefish Lions, past commodore of the Whitefish Lake Boat Club, past president of the Associated Chambers, director of the First State Bank and Whitefish Credit Union.

On Oct. 6, 1939 he was married to Toni Weber in Spokane. She survives as does a brother, John Irwin, Edgewood, B.C.

Pioneer Dies At Missoula

MISSOULA — A pioneer of the Flathead Valley, Claude J. Iseminger, 89, of 531 E. Pine died in a local rest home Tuesday.

He came to the Flathead Valley in 1898 from Iowa where he and his twin brother and father homesteaded a farm northwest of Kalispell.

Oct. 4, 1905, he married Hazel B. Young in Kalispell. In 1924 he moved into Kalispell and worked at the Kalispell Mercantile.

Mr. Iseminger and his wife moved to Missoula in 1941 where he worked for the Missoula Mercantile and later worked for Dragstead's Men's Wear until he retired in 1959.

His wife preceded him in death in May 1970.

He was a member of the First Christian Church.

Services for Mr. Iseminger will be Friday at 1:30 p.m. at the First Christian Church in

Missoula with the Rev. Paul Dean Hill officiating. Burial will be in the family plot at the Missoula Cemetery.

The body will lie in state until Friday noon at the Squire, Simmons and Carr Rose Chapel.

Mr. Iseminger is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Lyle B. (Thelma) Carr, Missoula, one grandson, three great-grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.
