

## Lydia Query Dies; Rites Announced

Mrs. Lydia Viola Query, 91, Rt. 2, Kalispell, died at the Friendship Manor in Bigfork Friday morning. Mrs. Query was born March 18, 1881 at Clarinda, Iowa, a daughter of Samuel and Amanda Dunn. She had received her education in Iowa, and March 21, 1918, she was married to William Query at Alliance, Neb.

In 1920, the couple moved to Montana where they homesteaded south of Chester. In 1938, they moved to Kila where they ranched until moving to Evergreen in about 1952. They had lived at Foy Lake for the past seven years. Mrs. Query was a Methodist.

She was preceded in death by her husband, William, on April 6, 1971, and has no immediate survivors.

Funeral services for Mrs. Query will be conducted in the Johnson Chapel at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday with the Rev. John Lewis, pastor of the Epworth United Methodist Church, officiating. Interment will be in the Conrad Memorial Cemetery.

He was a postal worker in the Whitefish post office for many years and served as city clerk for Whitefish for a time. He was married Sept. 10, 1920 to Emma Maude Isaacson who preceded him in death March 9, 1964.

Other survivors include a son, William N. Quam of Santa Barbara, Calif., and a sister, Tina Ekanger, Oakridge, Ore.

Memorial services are planned for Quam, whose body was cremated in Oregon, in Whitefish sometime in mid-September.

Mrs. Kathie Quilligan, 89, died in Hot Springs Tuesday. She was born July 8, 1883, at Elsehaug, Norway, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Breimo. She had lived with her parents at Varda, North Cape, Norway until coming to America in 1906 when she married Michael Quilligan.

The couple farmed in the valley until 1918 when they went into sheep and cattle business.

In 1929 they moved to Hot Springs and built the Quilligan Apartments which they have operated since. Mrs. Quilligan was a member of the Lutheran Church of Hot Springs. She was preceded in death by her husband in 1937 and by one brother in 1968.

She is now survived by three sisters, Mrs. Anna Holand, Somers; Mrs. Martin Westwang, Medford, Ore., and Mrs. Signe Bonney, Portland and several nieces and nephews. Funeral arrangements for Mrs. Quilligan will be announced by the Johnson Funeral Home.
