Gordon Iverson

Funeral services for Gordon John Iverson, 50, Hungry Horse, were conducted Monday in the Van Leuven Funeral Home. The Rev. Ron Paulson, Our Savior's Lutheran Church, officiated. Organist was Mrs. Bill Janson. Interment was in Glacier Memorial Gardens. Pallbearers were Lee Berg, Butch Cady, Gordon Green, Larry Green, Bob Miller, and Stan Swensen.

Mr. Iverson died March 22 from injuries received in a construction accident at St. Ignatius.

He was born Jan. 8, 1923 in Grafton, N. Dak. and moved to Thief River Falls, Minn., as an infant. He resided there and was employed as a switchman and carpenter for the Soo Line Railroad for 17 years. The family moved to the Flathead in 1966. He had been employed as a stone mason on the Garden Wall, Glacier National Park, and had worked as a carpenter. At the time of his death he was employed by Nicholas and Sons Construction Co. Hungry Horse, at St. Ignatius. He was a member of the Eagles Lodge in Minnesota.

He was married to Hilda Marie Skretvedt Jan. 29, 1943 at Thief River Falls.

Survivors include his widow, four sons, David and Jackie, both of Columbia Falls; Jerome and Dennis, both of Hungry Horse; one daughter, Mrs. Einar (Gayle) Samuels, Lake Blaine; his mother, Mrs. Gertie Iverson, Thief River Falls; three brothers, Allen, Thief River Falls; Edgar, Spokane; and Clayton, Bigfork.
