Curtis K. Maxey, 69, 1653 Woodland Ave., died Saturday in Flathead Health Center. He was a retired farm placement representative for the Montana State Employment Service and a cattle feeder.

Mr. Maxey was born in Missoula Aug. 31, 1905, the son of Lt. Col. and Mrs. Robert J. Maxey. He attended schools in Missoula and various places in the United States and the Philippines, where his father was stationed as an Army officer, later attending Riverside Military School in Gainesville, Ga., Norwich University in Northfield, Vt., and the University of Georgia in Athens.

He also attended the University of Montana where he studied journalism, after which he worked for the Seattle P.I. In the 1930s he was a guide in Glacier National Park for the Noffsinger Company.

Mr. Maxey married Beth Bole on May 21, 1942 at Camp Roberts, Calif., where he was stationed. During his Army service he served as a troop transportation officer on merchant ships in the European theater. Following his military service he returned to his job with the Montana State Employment Service, which he had begun when it was formed in 1933, and worked in their Helena, Billings, Missoula, Bozeman and Kalispell offices. He came to the Kalispell office in 1946, later resigning due to health reasons. He then formed a partnership with Glen Phanco

to feed cattle, retiring from this 10 years ago.

Mr. Maxey had been very active in the Kalispell Saddle Club, Western Montana Horsemen's, as well as the Big Sky and American Morgan Horse Association and the American Horse Council, Washington, D.C. His interest in horses continued from his college days, where he played polo, until the present and promoted horsemanship with the youngsters. Each year at the Northwest Montana Fair the Maxey trophy is awarded in the fitting and showing class in his name.

Mr. Maxey was a nephew of Eloise Knowles, an early day teacher at the University of Montana, for whom Knowles Hall is named, and was a grandson of Montana's pioneer Judge Hiram Knowles.

Surviving besides his widow, Beth, is one cousin. He was preceded in death by his parents, and a brother, Rad Maxey in Helena in 1968.
