For the past 35 years, Buck owned and operated Howard Buck's Gardens south of Columbia Falls. He also did carpentry work.

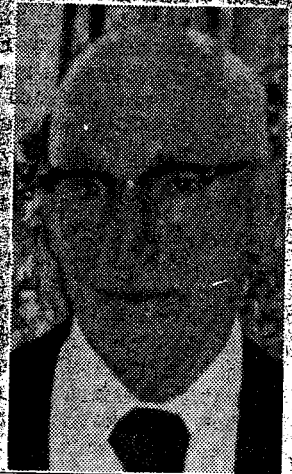
He was married to Beulah Chapman on June 1, 1938, in Kalispell.
