Kenneth Paul, 90

Kenneth Paul, 90, died at his home in Kalispell on Friday evening.

He was born Nov. 14, 1898, on the family farm at Holt, north of Bigfork, a son of George and Mattie J. Paul. He attended school in District 12, Pleasant View School, then located on a part of the Paul farm.

In 1918, he was graduated from a specialized course in English and mechanics at Flathead County High School. He then, with his brother George, took over operation of their farm, due to the illness and death of his father. He farmed and worked in the Bigfork area, living with and caring for his mother until 1939.

In September 1939, he enlisted in the Montana National Guard in Kalispell and went with Company F, 163rd Infantry Regiment, to Fort Lewis, Wash. On December 7, 1941, at the time of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, his unit was alerted they would be inducted into the U.S. Army, and on Dec. 12, they were attached to the 41st Division. They were sent to Australia, where they trained for equatorial and jungle fighting and went into combat in New Guinea, in January, 1943. Mr. Paul and his unit were caught in enemy machine gun crossfire and he was severely wounded on Jan. 16, 1943. He was moved to Brisbane, Australia, for treatment of



wounds and malaria. In June 1943, he returned to Modesto, Calif., for further treatment there and in Utah. He was awarded the Purple Heart and held Asiatic and Pacific Combat Ribbons when he was given a medical discharge on Oct. 6, 1943 and returned to Montana.

On Oct. 16, 1943, he married Elizabeth E. "Betty" Wright in Kalispell. They made their home in Bigfork, where Kenneth was affiliated with E. M. Wright Real Estate Agency until his appointment to the Flathead County Appraisal Board in 1948, later becoming a deputy in the office of the Flathead County Assessor until his retirement in 1964.

Mr. Paul was a member of the Epworth United Methodist Church; the Bigfork Post of the American Legion and the 41st Infantry Association.

He was preceded in death by his parents and five half-brothers, Charles, Oran, Ralph, Cleave and Glenn Bartlett and his brother George Paul.

He is survived by his wife, Betty, at home; a daughter, Judith Ann Sine of Hamilton and many nieces, nephews and great-nieces and great-nephews.
