Highway Patrol officer dies of apparent suicide

^{1 Nov 1993}
Veteran Montana Highway Patrol officer Henry "Jake" Jacobson, 54, died Monday evening at his Kalispell home of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

Sheriff-Coroner Jim Dupont said Jacobson's body was sent to the state crime lab in Missoula for an autopsy, a standard procedure when a law enforcement officer dies.

Kalispell Police Chief Ad Clark said his officers were called to the Seventh Avenue East home about 9 p.m. Police found Jacob-

son's body in an upstairs bedroom and summoned the coroner.

Dupont said Jacobson had stopped for drinks with friends at a private residence after finishing his 6 p.m. shift Monday. His wife and step-daughter, who were downstairs, called police after hearing the gunshot and finding his body.

Jacobson joined the patrol in March 1968 and transferred to the Flathead from Glasgow in January 1975.

Sgt. Richard Boettcher of the patrol called Jacobson a hard-working officer, but said he had seemed a little depressed lately. He said in recent months, Jacobson had talked often of retiring.

Survivors include his wife, Kim, and a son and daughter from a previous marriage.

Henry Arthur Jacobson, 54

Henry Arthur Jacobson, 54, died at his home in Kalispell on Monday evening, Nov. 1, 1993.

He was born Sept. 21, 1939, in Malta, to Henry J. and Hazel Jacobson. He was a graduate of Malta High School and a graduate of the Jefferson Technical Institute of Minneapolis, Minn.

He had been a Montana Highway Patrolman for 26 years having worked at Glasgow, Wolf Point and Malta until coming to Kalispell, where he has lived for the past 20 years.

He had served in the Montana National Guard and was a member of the Montana Peace Officers Association and past member of the Northwest Montana Stock Car Association. He loved racing cars.

He was preceded in death by his father, Henry Joseph Jacobson in 1954; and a brother, Jeff Jacobson in 1993.

In 1987, he was married to Kimberli Reindel in Kalispell and is now survived by her at the family home.

He is also survived by a step-daughter, Pedra Jacobson at the home; a son, Henry Joseph Jacobson of Missoula; a daughter, Jacqueline Sargent and her husband, Ron, of Bonni Lake, Wash.; his mother, Hazel Jacobson of Chico, Calif.; a brother, Jon Jacobson and his wife, Penny and two sisters, Mary Jill Anderson and Abby Orndoff and her husband, Forrest, all of Chico; a sister, Julie Lyall of Orange, Calif.; and several nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. on Friday in Riverside Alliance Church with the Rev. Michael Phillips officiating. Cremation will follow the services.
